### PRAYER VIGIL IN SUPPORT OF DETAINED MIGRANT CHILDREN

The United Methodist Church has spoken very clearly on this matter of loving our neighbors, especially the marginal, the lost and the least. General Conference delegates from around the world call on us to advocate for the "elimination of indefinite detention [and the] incarceration of children." (Book of Resolutions 3281). And, as a church we also very clearly "oppose immigration policies that separate family members from each other or that include detention of families with children." (Social Principles ¶162.H).
