HELPFUL HINTS FOR FAMILIES WITH CHILDREN

- The St. John's Prayground is located in the front of the sanctuary. This is a place
 for children and their families to worship together, allowing children to more fully

- A staffed nursery for infants through preschool is open every Sunday morning and is located next door in our Education/Administration building.
- Changing tables are located in the restrooms in the back of the sanctuary and in our nursery.
- Children are welcome to receive Holy Communion, which is served weekly at 8:30 a.m. and on the first Sunday of the month at 11 a.m. Our communion elements are bread and grape juice. Gluten-free elements are also available.
- Sunday School is offered for children starting at age 18 months through 12th grade from 9:45-10:45 a.m.

Join us on Ash Wednesday as we begin the season of Lent with reflection, prayer, and worship. From 10:30 a.m. - 1 p.m. the Family Life Center will be transformed into a quiet space for self-guided worship. Sit in silence or journey through prayer activities and meditations. We will also have a labyrinth set up for you to experience that ancient prayer practice, and Pastor Lane will be on hand to offer the imposition of the ashes.
