TODAY - MEETING FOR FAMILIES WITH TEENAGERS

We will dedicate the first hour of Youth Group on to hosting a meeting for families raising teenagers (6th-12th grades). We invite Youth and their grown-ups (parents, grandparents, guardians) to attend. We will go over the fall schedule and update our records (emergency information sheets and photo release forms) for the school year. It will also be an opportunity to share feedback on the areas of St. John's Youth ministry that are thriving and which areas need improvement. We will meet from **4-5 p.m. in the Youth Room**. Following the meeting, our Youth will gather from 5-6 p.m.

TODAY - MUSIC MAKERS

Music Makers will be making music on **Sunday afternoons from 4:30-5:30 p.m.**, in the Choir Room with Dr. Steve. Children from Kindergarten through 5th grade will meet <u>the first three Sundays of every month</u>. Youth (6th - 12th grades) will join whenever special music is planned. Music Makers will perform in worship on September 24, October 22, November 26, and December 17. The Youth will join us for special music during the season of Advent leading into Christmas. Our children have so much musical talent and we are planning a fun and spirit-filled time through singing and playing instruments. Children may be dropped off and picked up from the Choir Room. NEW YOUTH SCHEDULE

As we enter and head into a new school year, St. John's Youth is making some changes to our fellowship and Bible Study times. This school year we will meet for worship and Bible study on the **1st and 3rd Sundays of each month from 4-6 p.m.** Also, we will meet on the **2nd and 4th Wednesdays of each month from 6-8 p.m.** for a time of fun and fellowship. This schedule is designed to hopefully accommodate the busy schedules of our students. We also hope this will allow our students to re-prioritize the time we have together, since we will not be meeting every week. We begin this schedule today.

SUNDAY FLOW FOR CHILDREN AND YOUTH

St. John's has a new flow for children & youth on Sunday mornings. Students should be **signed-in by an adult (18 years or older) between 9:30 - 9:50 a.m.** in the Upstairs Cafe or at the sign-in station located at the base of the stairwell. (Children in the nursery and toddler classes will continue to sign in at their classrooms.)

The 20-minute window of time in the Upstairs Cafe is the designated fellowship and fun time for our students on Sunday mornings. This is their chance to hang out and play before the Sunday School lessons start at 9:50 a.m. Sunday School teachers will then escort students to their classrooms to promptly begin lessons at 9:50 a.m.

Students will also need to be *signed-out by an adult or an older sibling (at least youth age) at the end of Sunday School, around 10:50 a.m.* Older, youth-age siblings can sign-out younger siblings only if Connor has been directly notified of this preference.

This new Sunday flow is being adopted in an attempt to better comply with St. John's UMC's Safe Sanctuaries Policy, which requires that no student be left unattended on campus. Establishing solid rules for check-in and pick-up during Sunday School help our leaders ensure any adults who bring children with them on Sunday mornings are aware where the child is at all times.

C.H.A.O.S. IS COMING!

During our first C.H.A.O.S. event on August 27, we will focus on how we can bring Christ to other spaces by living out the teachings of Jesus through our actions. What does the Word of God say about how we should act? How do our actions lead others toward Christ and invite Christ into any space we might enter? We will explore these questions through fun and engaging activities and lessons designed for the whole family. We can't wait to see everyone there!
