#### FIRST QUARTER FINANCIAL UPDATE

from Mike Creed. Finance Committee Chair

In the first quarter of 2023, revenues were \$167,088 representing 30% of our annual budget, with the majority of the excess amount coming from annual Pledges that were paid in January. This means approximately \$22,350 was prepaid for the year. On the expense side, all expenses were in line with the budget, with the exception of a couple of small items that are paid annually in the first quarter. Our excess of revenues over expenses for the quarter stood at \$22,810, so a quick analysis indicates that if the pledges of an additional \$22,350 would not have been paid, we would have been right at a neutral position on the budget, which is outstanding, given that our budget for the year was approved with an approximate \$23,146 deficit for the year or \$5,787 for the quarter.
