HELPFUL HINTS FOR FAMILIES WITH CHILDREN

 bread and grape juice. Gluten-free elements are also available.
- Sunday School is offered for children starting at age 18 months through 12th grade from 9:45-10:45 a.m.

NEW WORSHIP SERIES - "SUMMER ON THE MOUNT"

Beginning June 18, we will spend our, "Summer on the Mount," through our worship series. In his Sermon on the Mount, Jesus gives us a sort of theological pep talk, not only to help us feel better about life, but to offer practical ways to help us live as God would have us live, that we might then help create the world as God envisions it. This summer we will offer a church-wide Bible Study on Jesus' "Sermon on the Mount" on Sunday mornings in the sanctuary beginning **June 18 from 9:55-10:45 a.m.** Many of our adult Sunday School classes will be joining in this 7-week study. We invite you to participate in the study, too! We've lined up a great team of facilitators, including Pastor Lane, Rev. Bernie Johnson, Rev. Marie Williams, Rev. Together we will examine some of Jesus' most profound and memorable teachings along with a video featuring Dr. Amy-Jill Levine, author of Sermon on the Mount: A Beginner's Guide to the Kingdom of Heaven. Taking themes from her book, we'll discuss how Jesus's teachings about forgiveness, kindness, prayer, and salvation are still relevant for us today. (It is not necessary to read or purchase the book, although for those who want to have it as a reference, you can buy the book online from Amazon or Cokesbury.)

COFFEE TIME UPDATE
