STEWARDSHIP UPDATE

As of November 15, we have received 88 pledges totaling \$495,335. We celebrate 43 households have increased their pledges and we welcome 12 new first-time pledging households. If you haven't turned in a pledge for 2025, please complete your pledge online (stjohnsbr.org/pledge-2025) or with a printed pledge card (available in the Office and Narthex) as soon as possible. Our aspirational budget for 2025 is \$687,102.

We know that circumstances change, including personal finances, and so Pledges do not automatically renew each year. Please complete a new pledge annually. If you have your pledge set up as a recurring gift through the online system, please make sure to log in and enter your new 2025 pledge with a new start and end date for next year. Just make sure to let her know if you want to cover the processing fee.
