#### HELPFUL HINTS FOR FAMILIES WITH CHILDREN

  for children and their families to worship together, allowing children to more fully

- A staffed nursery for infants through preschool is open every Sunday morning and is located next door in our Education/Administration building.

The General Conference is the only body that can set official policy and speak for the denomination. The 862 delegates, half clergy and half lay, will come together to consider revisions to church polity, as well as adopt resolutions on current moral, social, public policy and economic issues. The General Conference will also approve plans and budgets for church-wide ministry for the next four years. Delegates will worship, pray, debate, and vote as one body.
