#### 8-SESSION BIBLE STUDY STARTS AT THE END OF JANUARY

Our upcoming Bible Study on James, 1 & 2 Peter, 1, 2, & 3 John, and Jude explores these letters not only with a keen theological eye and a pastor's heart, but also with the imagination of a poet and master storyteller. Guy Johnson will be leading this 8-session Bible Study using the Immersion workbook as the guide, which is designed to help us explore the emotional, spiritual, and intellectual needs of our faith.
