ASH WEDNESDAY WORSHIP OPPORTUNITIES

Join us on Ash Wednesday, March 5, as we begin the season of Lent with reflection, prayer, and worship. From **10:30 a.m. - 1 p.m.** the Family Life Center will be transformed into a quiet space for self-guided worship. Sit in silence or journey through prayer activities and meditations. We will also have a labyrinth set up for you to experience that ancient prayer practice, and Pastor Lane will be on hand to offer the imposition of the ashes. This experience is open and appropriate for all ages. St. John's Youth will meet to experience the stations at 1pm.

There will also be an **Ash Wednesday service in the sanctuary at 6:30 p.m.** that includes the imposition of ashes and Communion. Our Lenten theme, "Full to the Brim," will be woven throughout our evening service, inviting us to receive and share God's abundant, overflowing grace.

"FULL TO THE BRIM" LENT WORSHIP SERIES

This year's Lenten worship series, "Full to the Brim" is filled with parables and promises of God's overflowing grace, reminding us to live fully. And so, this Lent, let us trust – fully – that we belong to God. Let us increase our capacity to receive and give grace. Join us Sundays during Lent, starting March 9, as we discover the expansive life God dreams for us.

"FULL TO THE BRIM" LENT BIBLE STUDY: TUESDAYS DURING LENT

Join us for a five-week Lent Bible Study as we journey through the parables and promises of God's abundant and expansive grace. This study will expand upon the Gospel readings from our Lent worship series, "Full to the Brim," allowing space for further reflection, conversation, and spiritual growth in a small group setting. We will offer two sessions of the study, both starting on March 11: Daytime Study – Tuesdays at 10:30-11:30am and Nighttime Study – Tuesdays at 6-7pm.

The study will be led by a rotating team of facilitators who will guide the discussion. The morning facilitators are Rev. Barbara Duke, Rev. John Gilmore, Jami Prince, Rev. Larry Norman, and Rev.
