## HELPFUL HINTS FOR FAMILIES WITH CHILDREN

We fully welcome and love engaging children in worship! We include a special Children's Moment each Sunday.

(Children in the nursery and toddler classes will continue to sign in at their classrooms.) Students will also need to be signed-out by an adult or an older sibling (at least youth age) at the end of Sunday School, around 10:50 a.m. Older, youth-age siblings can sign-out younger siblings only if Connor has been directly notified of this preference.

## LABOR DAY CLOSURES

## MIDYEAR FINANCIAL REPORT

In the first half of 2024 our revenues totaled \$321,227, representing 52% of our annual budget. The excess amount is due in part to a \$9,000 grant received from the Louisiana United Methodist Foundation for youth ministry. Our expenses through June were \$309,846, representing 48% of the budget. This means the excess of revenues over expenses stood at \$11,380.

It should be noted that during the first half of the year, expenses were lower than budget due to the postponement by the Trustees of maintenance issues, which they hope to attend to this fall, as funds are available.

The Finance Committee recently formed a subcommittee to begin exploring non-traditional streams of revenue for the church. If you have ideas or interest in this, please let us know!
