- Sunday School is offered for children starting at age 18 months through 12th grade from 9:45-10:45 a.m.

MEET & GREET OUR NEW BISHOP!

You are invited to attend the Service of Installation for Bishop Delores J. Williamston, the 11th bishop of The Louisiana Conference of The United Methodist Church on Saturday, **March 4 at 11 a.m. in Lawless Chapel at Dillard University in New Orleans**. It will be a joyous occasion to gather for worship and celebrate the historic installation of the first African-American bishop to be assigned to the Louisiana Conference, and the first African-American female to be elected bishop in the South Central Jurisdiction of The United Methodist Church.

Bishop Williamston has begun a Boots on the Ground Tour, meeting with clergy, laity, and members of local congregations all across Louisiana. All Laity of the Baton Rouge District are invited to meet with her on **Saturday, March 11 from 10:00am-11:30am at Wesley UMC** (544 Government St Baton Rouge, LA 70802). This gathering gives Bishop Williamston the opportunity to listen to United Methodist' hopes and dreams in Louisiana, hear their concerns, and learn of their interests. She also hopes to offer guidance and support for the coming year.

UMCOR EARTHQUAKE RELIEF
