Hey everyone! My name is Connor Dean, and I am excited about becoming the new Director of Youth and Children's ministries at St. John's UMC. I'm originally from Sulphur and grew up going to church at Henning Memorial UMC. My experience leading in youth ministry started in high school when I took on various leadership roles at the local, district, and conference levels.
